Today's gospel is surly dedicated to one of St. John's expressed intentions--faith. The story of the risen Lord making a delectable shore breakfast for his friends after seeing to a record catch, seems so spectacular. Yet, there is a sort of normal-ness to the scene. The disciples seem to take the miraculous in stride. The only issues to be addressed did not include disbelief, but identity and Peter's brief and nearly humorous bout with modesty (Peter wouldn't it make more sense to remove your cloths to jump in the lake?) No one challenged the reasonableness of Christ's request to switch sides of the boat for better fishing success. The disciples seemed steeped in faith once they recognized their once dead friend. It is as if it took extra time to identify their Lord in his glorified body. Perhaps their mortal eyes needed time to become familiar with the beauty of the resurrected Christ. Maybe that is our task as well, to recognize our risen Savior in the eyes of his world. ja+

Next Sunday, May 2nd, All Saints' Church, along with the other Episcopal Churches across North Dakota, will be taking up a special offering for our new bishop, Michael Smith.
