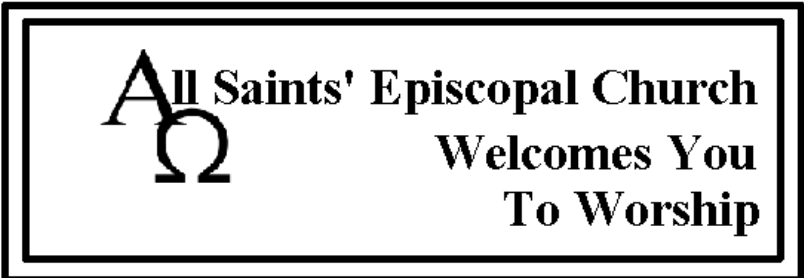

Dear Saints,

What is in a word like Messiah or Father?

Today's Gospel makes me really think about the meaning of titles and names. In this familiar piece, Jesus seems to be saying, 'Look, it doesn't really matter what title people give me, does it? Call me a prophet, John or Elijah, or the Messiah, or the Son of Man. My title cannot change the truth that I am God's Son, sent to heal the world of sin—to suffer and die for the people.'

Jesus clearly understood what his mission was and, although faith in him was important, it didn't change what he was to do. In his case, the word Messiah was not as important as what it truly meant; he would have been the Savior of the world regardless of any title, even that one.

Now, I think of fatherhood in that way. Most adult males are capable of producing offspring. But, are they capable of being fathers? Fatherhood, like Messiahhood, is just a title, a word until it is lived into. On Father's day we don't celebrate the ability for a man to reproduce, we celebrate the loving task of fatherhood with all of its built in pain and joy. That fact opens up the celebration to all who have accepted that loving responsibility for another life, whether or not they are called fathers.

Like the word Messiah, the word Father has the meaning given it by the bearer. ja+
